NEED

Transgender is mysterious. Who they are? How they Live? Where they Live? There are many questions than answer. But the answer is that they are human beings like many others, may be different in gender.

TRANS GENDER

Transgender is a person whose identity of sex is different from the sex they were assigned at birth. For Instance: A transgender woman lives as a woman today, but was thought to be male when she was born. A transgender woman lives as a man today, but was thought to be female when she was born. This transition process includes hormone replacement therapy and sometimes sex reassignment surgery, which can bring relief and resolve feelings of gender dysphoria.

TRANS GENDER-Identity

Transgender people express their gender identities in different ways. Some people use their dress, behaviour, and mannerisms to live as the gender that feels right for them. Some people take hormones and may have surgery to change their body so as to match their inner gender identity. Some transgender people identify as neither male nor female, or as a combination of male and female.

TRANSGENDER-Societal problems:

Transgender people faces, innumerable problems. Their agony is immense and not understood by the outside world. Transgender agony starts when their parents who gave birth to them disown them. Family members and relatives also disown them. Transgender are subjected to severe discrimination, and harassment in their lives like verbal abuse, physical and sexual violence, false arrests, denial of ancestral property, denial of right to education, employment etc. The transgender are human beings and their inclusion and empowerment is necessary to make them as part of the society. To understand transgender problems and to mainstream them into the society, the present training programme is designed with the following objectives.
