Introduction to the Programme:

SDGs have been established as a 'blueprint for achieve a better and more sustainable future for all' set in 2015 by the United Nations General Assembly. These are a set of 17 global goals and intended to be achieved by the year 2030, as part of UN Resolution 70/1. These goals act as a guiding light for all nations of the world to orient their developmental programs in a manner that makes it possible for them to approximate and achieve these.

India being one of the largest developing countries in the world, has also taken cognizance of these goals and strives to achieve the SDGs through its various developmental programmes. This requires that the 17 SDGs as described by the UN are made an integral part of the developmental programmes of India. A capacity building programme with a focus on localisation of SDGs in the context of GPDP and Rural Development (RD) programmes.

This training programme focuses on the methods and techniques of integrating and localizing the SDGs in various rural development programmes of India.

Objectives of the Training Programme:

The main objective of this training programme is:

- To provide an orientation and introduction to the SDGs and their various sub-goals as described by the UN.
- To provide an orientation towards different methods and techniques that can be employed for localizing of SDGs in the context of RD programmes and GPDP.
- To provide training in choosing methods, materials and scientific tools relevant for addressing different social problems in the rural areas and their relevance for achieving the SDGs;
- To understand the usage and importance of SDGs, their integration and localization in the rural development programmes.

Programme Contents:

- Introduction to SDGs and their importance in the international context;
- Relevance of SDGs in the Indian context, especially in the rural development programs of India;
- Connections and integration of SDGs in the rural areas of each State;
- Localization of SDGs in the context of sustainable rural development;
- Importance of SDGs in the future developmental programmes and their role in guiding research and policy making.
- Some examples and case studies that show how SDGs have been integrated in the rural development programmes of India, such as MGNREG Schemes.

- Understanding of SDG goals and their sub-goals in the international context;
- Ways to integrate and localize these SDGs in the Indian context;
- How to discern the relevance of SDGs in the rural development programmes of India;
- How to embed the SDGs and its sub-goals in the local rural settings of different states of India as per their local environment and context.
