E) Background	Fisheries and aquaculture are an important source of food, nutrition, employment and income in India. The sector provides livelihood to about 16 million fishers and fish farmers at the primary level and almost twice the number along the value chain. Fish being an affordable and rich source of animal protein, is one of the healthiest options to mitigate hunger and malnutrition. Fisheries sector in India has shown impressive growth with an average annual growth rate of 10.88% during the year from 2014-15 to 2018-19. The fish production in India has registered an average annual growth of 7.53% during last 5 years and stood at an all-time high of 137.58 lakh metric tons during 2018-19. The export of marine products stood at 13.93 lakh metric tons and

(GoI, 2020)</p> <p>Foreseeing the immense potential for development of fisheries and for providing focused attention to the sector, the Government in its Union Budget, 2019-20 has announced a new scheme, the Pradhan Mantri MatsyaSampada Yojana (PMMSY). Since agriculture and other allied sectors contribute to the livelihood and employment generation of people living in rural areas, the Gram Panchayats, State Rural Livelihood Missions and other stakeholders need to converge their flagship programmes with PMMSY in order to provide nutrition, income, alternative livelihood and employment for the rural households.</p>
