The First floor building of Vijaya Bank Self Employment Training Institute (VIBSETI), Mandya was inaugurated on 21st March 2012. VIBSETI was founded on 24.12.1999 and sponsored by Vijaya Bank, Bangalore and Vijaya Rural Development Foundation, Mangalore. Apart from conducting training programmes, the institute trains candidates under various government sponsored schemes. Efforts have been made to modernize the institute with a computer lab, an exclusive class room with sewing machines and a fully furnished dining hall. As on March 2012, the institute has trained 17,020 candidates in various skill development programmes, out of which 9,064 are women. The total numbers of settled candidates are 13,019, i.e. settlement rate is 76%. The total investment on the new building and infrastructure has come to Rs. 100 lakhs which has been provided by MoRD, Govt. of India through NIRD Hyderabad.

Editorial

Importance of Feedback in Training

Dear Readers.

You are aware that all the RSETIs are conducting need based capacity building and skill upgradation training programmes for rural youth. As the training programmes are always set out with certain objectives, it becomes crucial to fathom whether those objectives were accomplished. In order to understand it, obtaining feedback from the participants of the training programmes evolves as an important component of the training module itself.

Feedback has to be taken systematically and structurally in terms of all aspects of the training such as designing, duration and contents of the course; sequence and coverage of the contents of a particular subject; relevance of a subject; and time allocated to it as well as methodology adopted.

Feedback undoubtedly helps in designing better training modules for future programmes. Further, it helps in better sequencing of the subjects, adding or deleting some specific topics or even subjects, rescheduling time slots and adopting a new methodology in case the situation demands.

In addition to the above, feedback may be obtained with regards to the deliverance of module components by each member of the faculty. As this is the sensitive part of the feedback, confidentiality regarding participants' identity besides the training personnel's efficiency is to be maintained. Every care has to be taken not to demoralize or demotivate a member of faculty but to improvise the overall standards of the training with strategy and forethought. The feedback about faculty members' performance may well serve as either a motivational or a developmental tool if an environment with no prejudice or malice is created.

When the training programme is a residential one, feedback must be obtained on accommodation, food and other logistics involved. Feedback on ambience of the training facility and adequacy of the course material is also essential in any case. The feedback obtained should be discussed with the participants in the valedictory session and if any specific issue is raised, it should be clarified. This will go a long way in developing better relationship with trainees. Feedback obtained should be compiled and preserved for future reference.

Let us pledge to move forward with a sense of dedication in every endeavor of ours.

Shri H Sambasiv Rao, AGM Staff College and Shri R Murli Krishna, Senior Manager PSC Dept. coordinated the conclave.

Project Enterprise (NIRD Initiative for Enterprise creation)

Project Enterprise is a unique initiative of NIRD for creation of micro enterprises by rural youth in the rural areas through skill development and confidence building. It is implemented through a few selective and committed CBOs in the tribal dominated and LWE Districts.

1. Regional Institute of Rural Development (RIRD), Krishnagiri Tamilnadu conducted two Skill Development Training Programmes of 10 days each on scientific ways of Mushroom Cultivation, at their institute, with 25 participants in each. The Project Director, RSETI recently visited Krishnagiri to interact with a few participants to get the feedback from five of the participants. Three participants already started mushroom cultivation and selling the mushroom in the market and are very happy. One of the participants who was working with HRD in a private company at Bangalore with a salary of Rs. 25,000/- left the job and started mushroom cultivation. Two participants were ready to start the activities. All the participants were very happy with the training imparted to them.



2. Indian Institute of Social Development (IISD), Indore, MP conducted two Skill Development Programmes of 8 weeks each for rural youth with 25 participants in each. Majority of trainees were from SC/ST categories. One at Thandla, Jhabua district for House Wiring & Electrical Equipment Repairing and other at Umarban, Dhar district for Electrical Workshop Power Inverter Repairing. The Project Director, RSETI visited the village Umarban to interact with the participants and to get the feedback. All the participants were highly motivated and confident to start their own activities. A few of them already started their activity while learning itself. IISD has good rapport with bankers and are in the process of 100% linkage with banks.



3.MYRADA Gulbarga conducted a Tractor Mechanic & maintenance training programme of 30 days duration for 25 school and college dropout youth from socially marginalized sections at Mahindra Showroom, Gulbarga. The objective of the training was to generate sustainable livelihood through

self employment for rural youth. The training was given in two batches - 15 candidates in the first batch and 10 candidates in the second batch so that every trainee gets fair chance to do hands-on practice. There were 5 mechanics and 3 students grouped together, for more practical exposure. Initially candidates were given soft skill training, at CIDOR Kamlapur. Two days orientation class for 25 candidates was conducted by Mahindra Company through PPT and videos on different tractor HPs, their machinery, engines, gear boxes and tools etc were explained to candidates. Every day 6 hours training was given to each candidate at workshop and sometimes the candidates were exposed to field work organized in rural area.



- 4. Centre of Science for Villages (CSV), Wardha conducted two programmes on Vermi Compost, one programmes on Food Processing (Ambadi & Yam) and one programmes on Making of Utility Items from Handmade paper. All these programmes were held in tribal dominated and/or LWE districts. Each programme had 40 participants. The participants were individual youth as well as SHGs leaders/ members. SHGs members/ leaders trained their members further in the trade. Thus there is a multiplying effect. Some of the trainees have started the activities individually and some in groups. The gaining of livelihood is reported to be around 60-65% and many more to start in near future.
- 5. **Lupin Foundation**, Bharatpur, Rajasthan conducted one skill development programme on Computer Hardware for 60 days duration with 25 participants in village Khumber. Another skill development programme was conducted on Repair and Rewinding of Electrical Motors of 60 days duration with 25 participants in village Bayana. The of gaining livelihood rate reported is 65-75% which may go upto 75-80%.
- 6. **MSGD**, Alwar Rajasthan conducted a skill development training programme on Computer Hardware & Networking for 30 days duration with 25 participants and another skill development programme on Household Wiring & Electrical Repairs for 30 days duration with 25 participants. Response to both of these programmes was overwhelming. Organizers are hopeful of more than 75-80 % settlement.

इस संस्थान का कार्यभार संभालने के बाद मुझे बहुत सारी दिक्कतों का सामना करना पड़ा परन्तु निरन्तरता एवं नि:स्वार्थ भावना के साथ गरीब लोगों की सेवा करने का जो कार्य शुरु करने का शुभ अवसर मुझे प्राप्त हुआ तथा अपने निजी अनुभव को उनसे बांटने शुरु किये तो मुझे ऐसा महसूस हुआ कि मेरी आत्मा की आवाज उनकी आत्मा से जुड़ रही है तथा मेरा मन अत्यन्त ही प्रसन्न हुआ । मैं अपना दु:ख दर्द भूल गया और उनकी परेशानियों में विलीन होता रहा और यही एक नुस्खा मेरे पास है । जो लोग मेरे पास प्रशिक्षण लेने आते हैं वो जाते समय ऐसा महसूस करते हैं कि वो मेरे अनुयायी हैं । दूसरी जो मुख्य बात हैं - कि आयोजक को तथा प्रशिक्षक को अच्छा मनोवैज्ञानिक ज्ञान होना अत्यन्त आवश्यक है क्योंकि हमारे पास प्रशिक्षण के लिए विभिन्न प्रवृत्तियों के लोग आते हैं । सभी अच्छी प्रवृत्ति के भी नहीं होते और सभी बुरे भी नहीं होते । यदि हम मनोवैज्ञानिक ढंग अपना कर उनकी प्रवृत्तियों को पहचाने तो काफी हद तक उनमें कुछ ही दिनों में सुधार ला सकते हैं ।

हालांकि यह स्थिति बाघ और बकरी को एक घाट पर पानी पीते देखने जैसी होती है परन्तु आदमी अपनी क्षमता से कर दिखाने में सिद्ध कर सकता है । तीसरी बात अनुशासन से जुड़ी है । यदि आयोजक / प्रशिक्षक अनुशासन का पालन नहीं करते हैं तो सीखने वाला, यदि अनुशासित भी है तो वह भी खराब हो सकता है इसलिए नियमों का निर्धारण प्रशिक्षण से पहले ही करें तथा उनका पूरा पालन करें व करवायें इसके लिए किसी को भी बिना ठेस पहुंचायें अनुशासन में रहने

की सीख देना अनिवार्य हैं। चौथी बात-शंका समाधान की हैं। प्रशिक्षण के दौरान, उससे पहले या बाद में प्रशिक्षु अपने मन में पैदा हुई शंकाओं के बारे में कुछ प्रश्न कर सकता है जिसके लिए आपको प्रभावी ढंग से उसका समाधान करना चाहिए। किसी भी प्रकार की कोई गलत जानकारी अगर आपने दे दी है तो उसके दुष्परिणाम सामने आ सकते हैं। पांचवी बात - सौहार्दपूर्ण माहोल का होना जरुरी हैं। आप उन्हें प्रशिक्षण दे कर कोई ऐहसान नहीं कर रह हैं बल्कि अपनी जिम्मेदारी निभा रहे हैं।

सबसे अच्छी और अहम बात यह है कि हमें सभी सरकारी विभागों से तालमेल बना कर रखना चाहिये। संगोष्ठियों / सेमिनार इत्यादि में भाग लेने और वहां अपने विचार रखने से आपकी लोकप्रियता बढ़ती है। गांव में जाकर नये व पुराने लोगों से मिलकर जागरुकता शिविर लगाये, लोगों की समस्याएं सुने व उन्हें आश्वस्त करें उनकी जरुरतों को समझते हुए प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम आयोजित किये जाते हैं।

बस यही सब कुछ है । मेरी सफलता का सफर ।


एस बी आई आरसेटी, बालू, जिला चम्बा, हि. प्र.
