#### WHO ARE WE?

National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (NIRDPR), an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India, is a premier national center of excellence in rural development and Panchayati Raj.

Established in 1958 as the National Institute of Community Development in Mussoorie, the institute moved to Hyderabad in 1965 and became the National Institute of Rural Development (NIRD) in 1977. On December 4, 2013, it was renamed the National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (NIRDPR) to broaden its mandate by integrating the Panchayati Raj system and enhancing the capacity building of its functionaries.





#### What we Do?

In its six decades, NIRDPR has been driving instrumental in qualitative improvements in program through training, management research, consultancy, policy advocacy, and technology transfer. The institute serves as a 'think-tank' for the Government of India and governments, focusing on rural development and Panchayati Rai initiatives. It also offers two full-time residential diploma programs and four distance PG diplomas addressing key issues in rural development.

NIRDPR provides guidance to 28 State Institutes of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, along with 90 Extension Centers, Training supporting the strengthening of the rural institutional network. It also facilitates financial support from the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) improve build infrastructure and faculty capacity in these institutions.



#### **Technology Transfer**

The Centre for Innovations and Appropriate Technologies (CIAT) promotes sustainable livelihoods and entrepreneurship in rural areas through capacity building. A variety of affordable rural technologies are showcased in the 65-acre Rural Technology Park at NIRDPR, including sustainable housing, sanitation, water harvesting, biogas, composting, hydroponics, and solar energy solutions.

#### Campus

The Institute is situated in an area of 174.21 acres with four guest houses 223 guest rooms, 11 conference halls with air conditioners and internet connectivity, an auditorium, community hall, health center with two medical officers, staff canteen, creche, sports complex with badminton court, TT room, swimming pool, yoga and gymnasium facilities, etc.

The Institute has a well-equipped library with a rich collection of 1,23,448 books on rural development and allied aspects. The library is completely digitized with institutional publications such as research highlights, training/reading materials and faculty publications on rural development.

The campus features two hostel blocks, Nilgiri and Vindhyachal, offering fully furnished rooms for separate accommodation of boys and girls. Each room is equipped with internet access via both LAN and Wi-Fi. A separate guest house with fully equipped rooms and dining facilities is available for accommodating visitors.




# Practical Learning
